A SPIRITUAL DROP FROM OUR PASTOR

Second Sunday of Lent

On this Lenten journey, I invite you to meditate on four important Christian virtues that can help us to draw closer to Jesus on his journey to the Cross. The first of these virtues is the great virtue of Sacrifice. When we hear the word "sacrifice" we often feel atraid because it implies pain and we tend to run away from anything that is painful. However, Jesus tells us, "
Whoever wants to follow me should take up his cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). We see that Jesus does not offer us
something easy or pleasant; he offers us a cross, something deeply uncomfortable. Yet, the one who offers us the cross is
Jesus, God Himself. Therefore, the focus is not on the cross itself, but on who offers it to us.

In this sense, all of our sacrifices – the great and the small – gain true meaning if we are united to the person of Christ.

Our struggles should not be considered as curses or punishments from God, but as valuable opportunities to demonstrate our love for Him by accepting our cross for His sake, just as He embraced His cross for ours. I know, that accepting the cross each day can be difficult. When you feel that you no longer have the strength to carry on, look at the Crucified One and think how much He loved you then and how much He loves you now. And say to Him, "For You Jesus, because I love You, I accept my cross." You will see that all your sacrifices will be rewarded. God loves you with infinite tenderness.

Lo sé, a veces no es nada fácil aceptar la cruz de cada día, cuando sientas que ya no tienes fuerzas para seguir mira al Crucificado y piensa cuanto te amó y cuanto te ama y dile: Por Ti Jesús, por amor a Ti acepto mi cruz. Verás que todos tus sacrificios serán recompensados.

Why should we perform acts of penance?

The primary reason is that we take Christ as our model and he himself undertook acts of penance in preparation for his ministry and before his passion. Acts of penance are theological in following the example of the Master. They are also practical in helping to accomplish goals of certain days and seasons.

In particular Lent is a season to reorder priorities and penance helps to be sure that created things are subordinate to divine realities in our lives. As it says in the Church's documents "Penance is a religious, personal act which has as its aim love and surrender to God" ("Paenitemini" chapter 1). Of course Scripture is clear as well that the rending of our hearts is the sacrifice the Lord desires. The various acts of penance put into physical reality what should be happening in our hearts. Of course, in the season of Lent it all works together to prepare for the passion of our Lord that will lead to resurrection.













